Reading Test-Taking Strategies

I. Read the questions first!

- <u>Underline</u> key words.
- Paraphrase the question in the margin.
- If the question is asking about a specific person/character, circle their name so you will remember to tune in when you see it in the text.
- If there are more than 6 questions, read the passage first.

2.Read the passage.

- Box words you don't know the meaning of, and then look for context clues around them to help you write a definition.
- <u>Underline</u> the main idea, and write "MI" next to it.
- <u>Underline</u> any information that will help you answer the questions.

3. Read the questions again.

- Cross out any answer choices that are *definitely* wrong.
- Go back to the passage and find evidence to support the best answer. Write the number of the question next to the evidence you found.

4. Double-check your evidence for ALL questions before

- moving on to the next passage.
 - If it's a vocabulary question, plug in the word-does it make sense?
 - Does your evidence support the BEST possible answer choice?
- 5. Remember to pace yourself and take breaks! Close your
 - test book and rest after every couple of passages!
